
Summer Safety from Lake Wenatchee Fire & Rescue



Campfire Safety

When spending time at the Lake Wenatchee State Park, there are a few safety reminders to keep in mind.

1: Always have a water source available when having a campfire.

2. Clear combustible materials away from campfire ring. These can be materials such as leaves, grass, wood chips, sticks, and pine needles.

- 3. Campfire ring should be at least 3 feet in diameter and 2 feet in height.
- 4. The area around the campfire ring should consist of loose soil or rock.
- 5. Children should NEVER play with matches.





Bear Country Bears have been know to visit the State Park during the Summer.

Please keep all food stored in a secure area and dispose of garbage.

Avoid making contact with bears and use bear spray only if needed.





Wear a Life Jacket

Lake Wenatchee has lakes and rivers that surround the area. If you plan on being in the water, please wear a life jacket.

Lake Wenatchee Fire & Rescue has donated life jackets near the boat launch at the State Park that can be used.
